


EDUCATIONAL VISITS

We continue to get regular visits from university students and primary school students.

Twenty school students came from a nearby village called Paparo. They came to visit for the second time together with a group of ten teachers and parents. Specially the adults are surprised when they see the variety of plants we have which they thought couldn't grow in this region. The children loved filling bags with soil and taking them to the table of the nursery. After that they harvested and ate guava. We are developing projects for children and adults related to agriculture, ecology, values and community. We hope to instill in them a sense of wonder and responsability for this amazing beautiful and fragile planet.

MARKET

Farmers face many problems when it comes to selling their produce. Many do not have transportation to take their goods to the market and depend on intermediaries who will pick up their produce for a cheap price. Many farmers also face bad roads which specially during rainy season become impossible to transit. We are supporting and joining local farmers selling our products directly to the clients. We use our transportation to pick up their produce and together we sell it every saturday morning on the market. The farmers are very happy as the economic benefit is quiet obvious. Nelson is making a lot of effort to make this happen every weekend. The mayor of Maporal, the town where the market is located, expressed he wants to support our effort helping with transportation from the municipality, which will be a big help.





WATERWELL

Centro Madre receives its drinking water from the water company through a water hose (installed by us) coming from the nearest village. As we are at the end of the supply line, the water often doesn't have enough pressure to reach our house, specially on Saturday when everybody washes their clothes, or other times when a farmer cleans the land accidently cutting our water hose. We are therefore extremely happy when finally we were able to install a water well on our land. INDER (Instituto para el desarrollo Rural) supplied the equipment and Centro Madre, the man power and the material. What is missing still is the pump that goes in the well to bring up the water and the irrigation system to bring the water to the plants.

CHRISTMAS AND A WHEELCHAIR

We serve the family of Señora Nora regularly buying adult diapers for her handicapped son. We buy them in Caracas for a much cheaper price than here in San Jose. Each time she pays us for three bags of diapers, Centro Madre donates one. This mother is often in despair when it comes to getting diapers for her son because due to the difficult economic crisis we are going through in Venezuela they are sometimes not available and when they are, they are more expensive than before. Besides diapers, we were also able to get a wheel chair for her son. This was thanks to Nelly Castro, a volunteer from Guatire (a nearby city) who joined our team six months ago and who's sister has a friend who has a sister who works for the Municipality in Caracas (that's how things work here).

We did our yearly Christmas celebration in two villages this year with children and adults making their own gifts with handicrafts. We also gave Christmas baskets with food, sheets and small gifts to 10 families with a handicapped child.
